Talk to employees and co-workers about what emergency supplies the company can feasibly provide, if any, and which supplies individuals should keep on hand.

Battery-powered commercial radio plus a radio that can receive weather alerts from the National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) are recommended. The NOAA weather radio can alert you to weather emergencies and potentially life-saving emergency information. The commercial radio is a good source for news and information from local authorities.

Keep copies of important records such as site maps, building plans, insurance policies, employee contact and identification information, bank account records, supplier and shipping contact lists, computer backups, emergency or law enforcement contact information and other priority documents in a waterproof, fireproof portable container. Store a second set of records at an off-site location.
